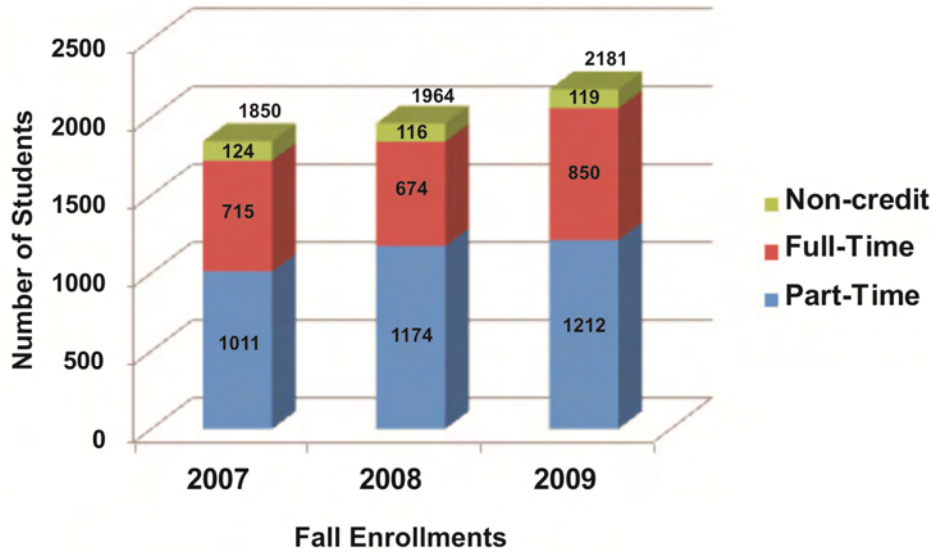

## Student Characteristics

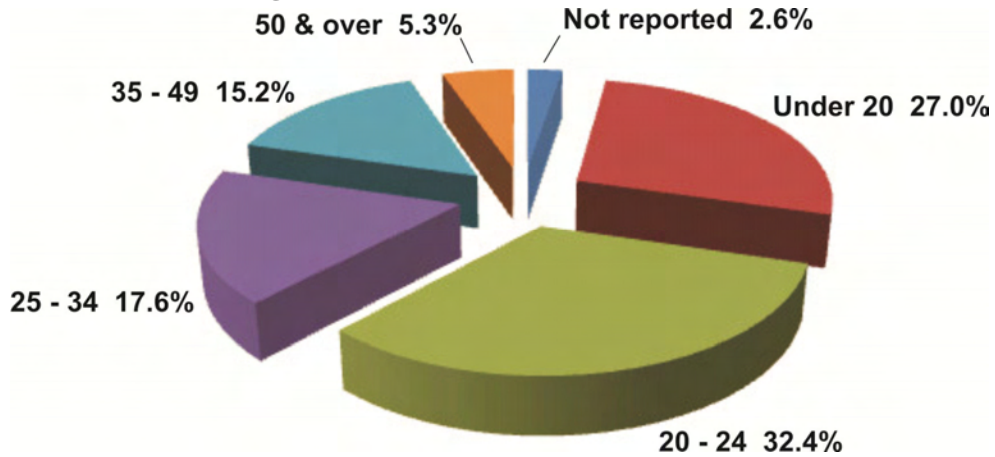
- For the Fall 2009 semester, 51% of the student population was comprised of females.
- For the Fall 2009 semester, almost 60% of all students were enrolled on part-time basis.
- For the Fall 2009 semester, the average age of part-time students was 31 years and 21.5 years for full-time students.
- Slightly more than 9% of students enrolled in Fall 2009 reported that they belonged to a minority group.
- For the Fall 2009 semester, almost 96% of enrolled students were from New Hampshire. Almost 87% of all students lived within 20 miles of Nashua.

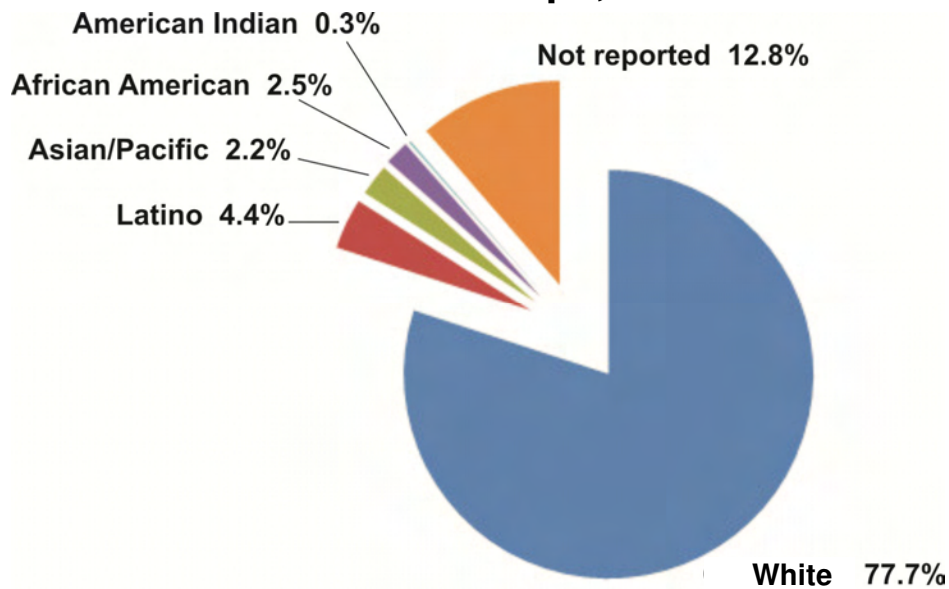
## Student Headcount



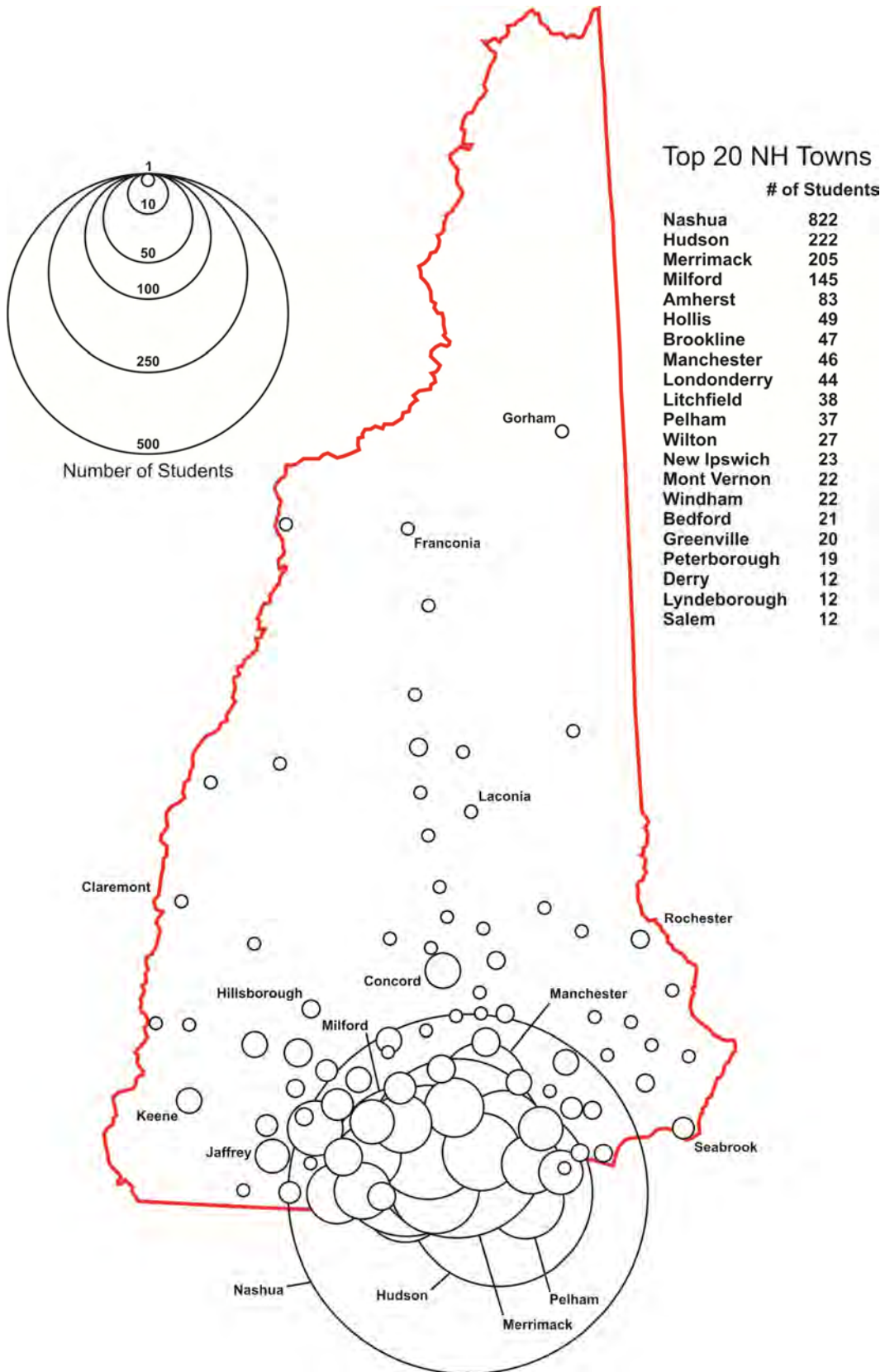
## Age of Students, Fall 2009

- For the Fall 2009 semester, the declared majors were enrolled in 33 associate degree programs and 21 certificate programs.

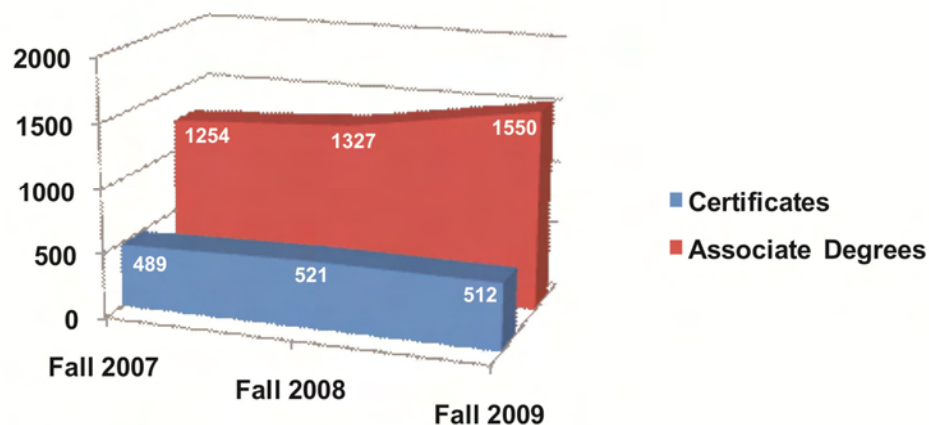

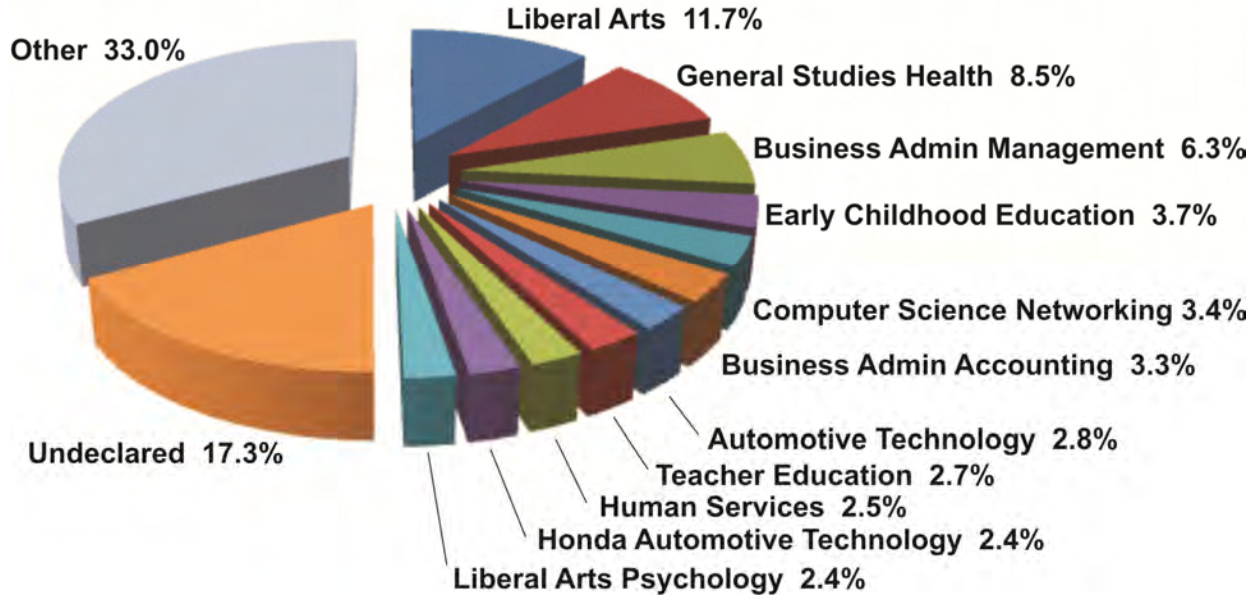

**Number of Declared Majors**



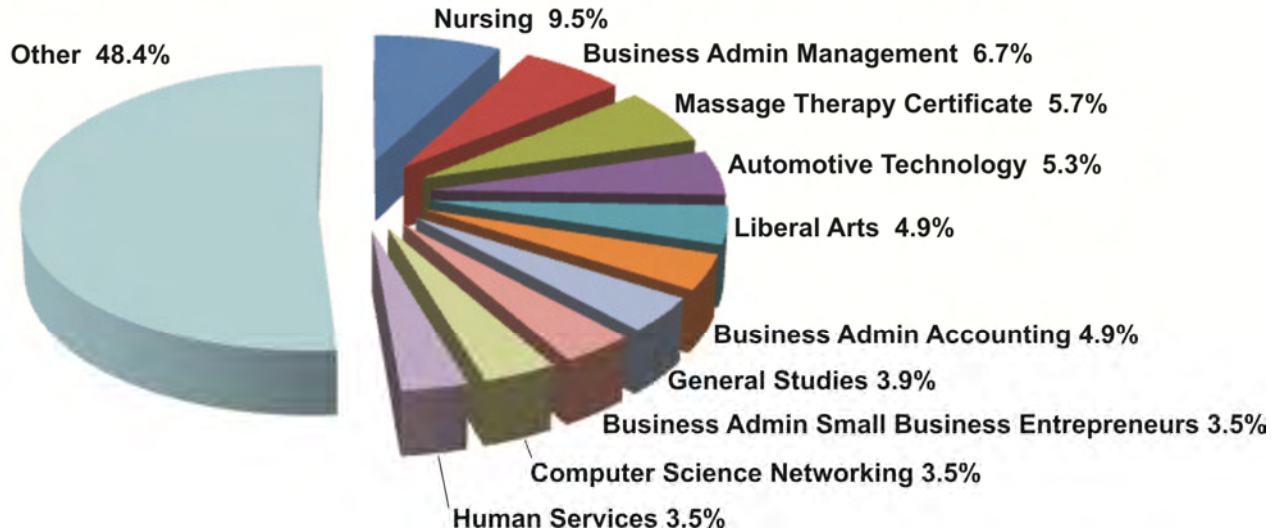
## Top Programs by Majors, Fall 2009

- 11 graduates received multiple awards.

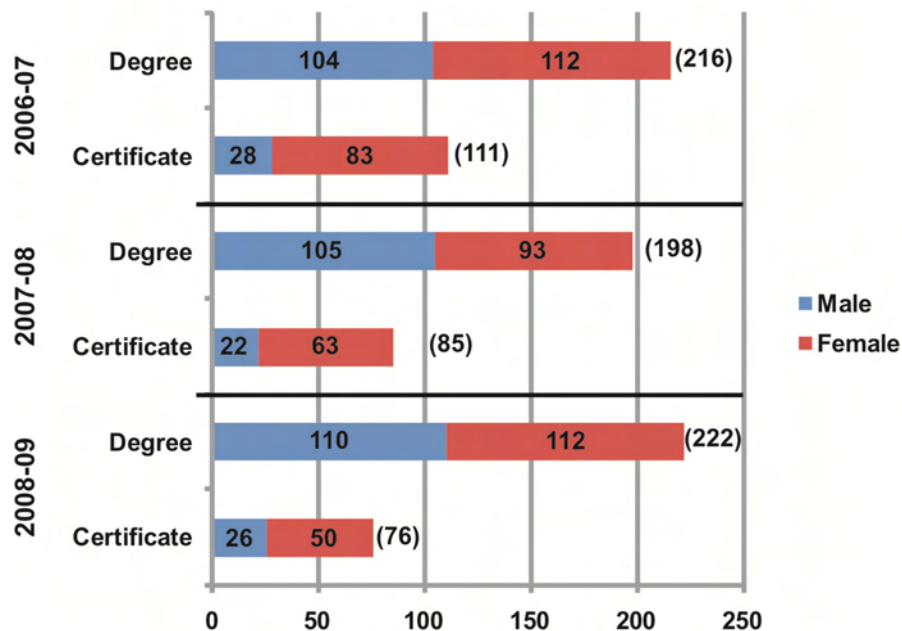

## Number of Awards by Type & Gender



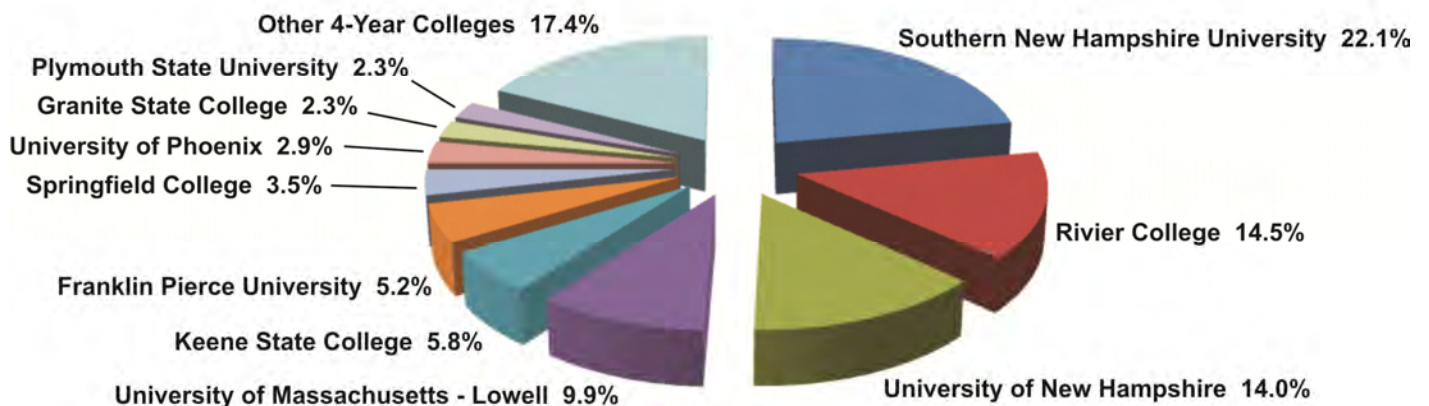
## Four Year College Enrollments (Academic Years 2006-7 through 2008-9)

Percent of Enrolled NCC Graduates



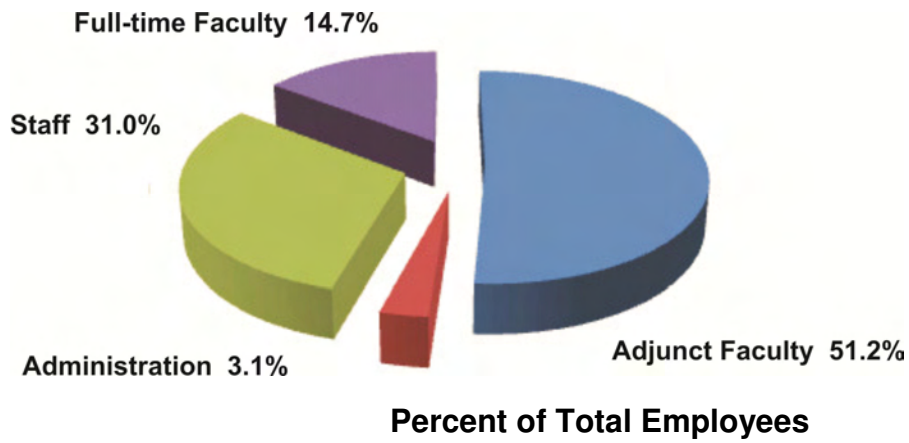
## Staff Characteristics

- College employees are grouped into three categories: administrators, faculty and staff.
- The Administration includes the president, vice presidents and directors.
- The College staff includes department managers, coordinators, counselors, admission recruiters, technicians, secretaries, library aides, security officers, maintenance, clerical and stock control personnel.
- For Fall 2009 semester, excluding adjunct faculty, 64% of the College employees were staff. Full-time faculty totaled 30% and administrative members comprised the balance of 6%.
- Fifty-one percent of the staff personnel were full-time. Females comprised 70% of the staff.
- Of the staff personnel, almost 14% have 10 or more years of service with the College while fewer than 70% of the staff have fewer than five years.

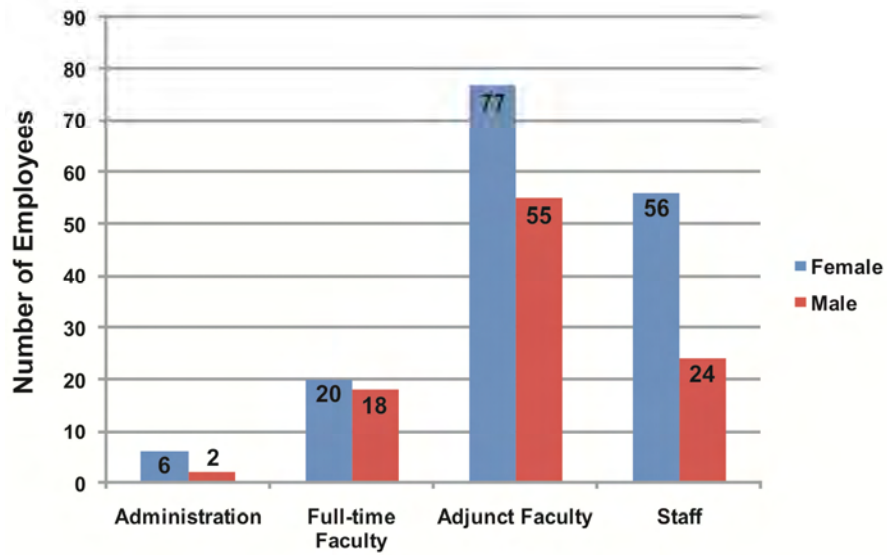

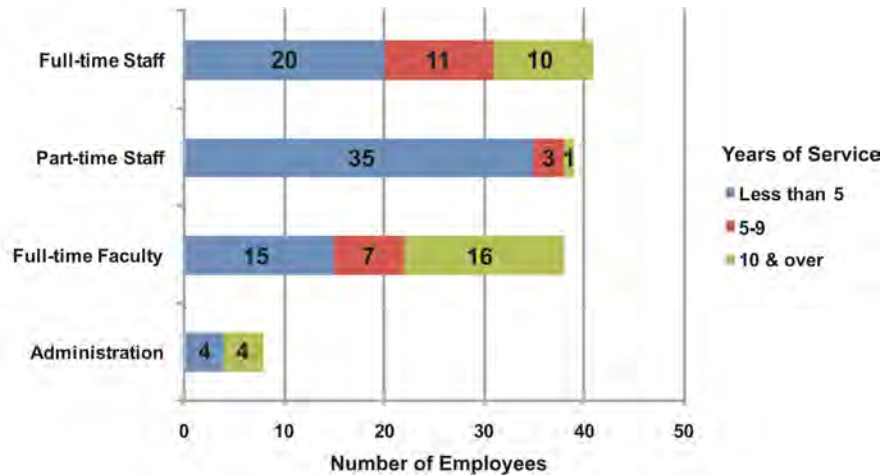
## College Employee Categories

## Years of College Service



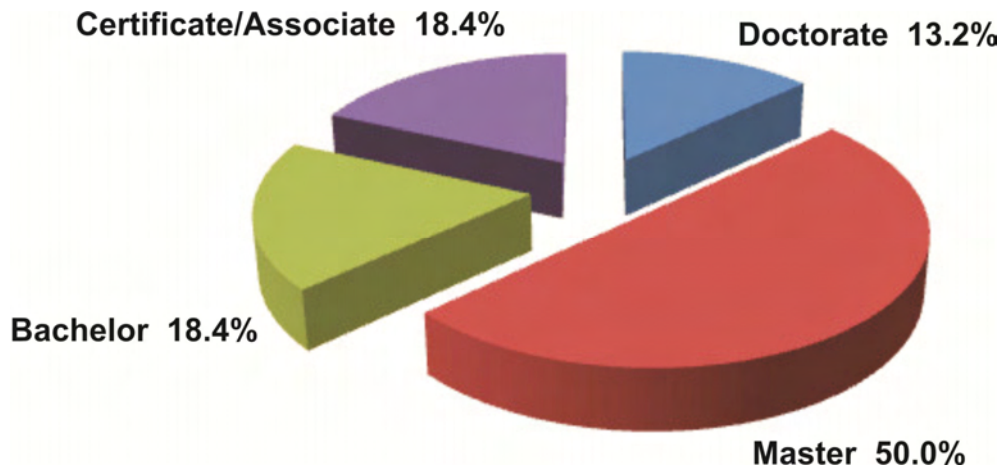
## Faculty Characteristics

- For the Fall 2009 semester, females comprised over 50% of the full-time faculty and almost 60% of the adjunct faculty.
- The Master's degree is the highest degree held by half of the full-time faculty. An additional 13% have earned a Doctorate degree.
- Over 40% of the full-time faculty have accrued 10 or more years of service with the College. Another 40% have five or fewer years of service.

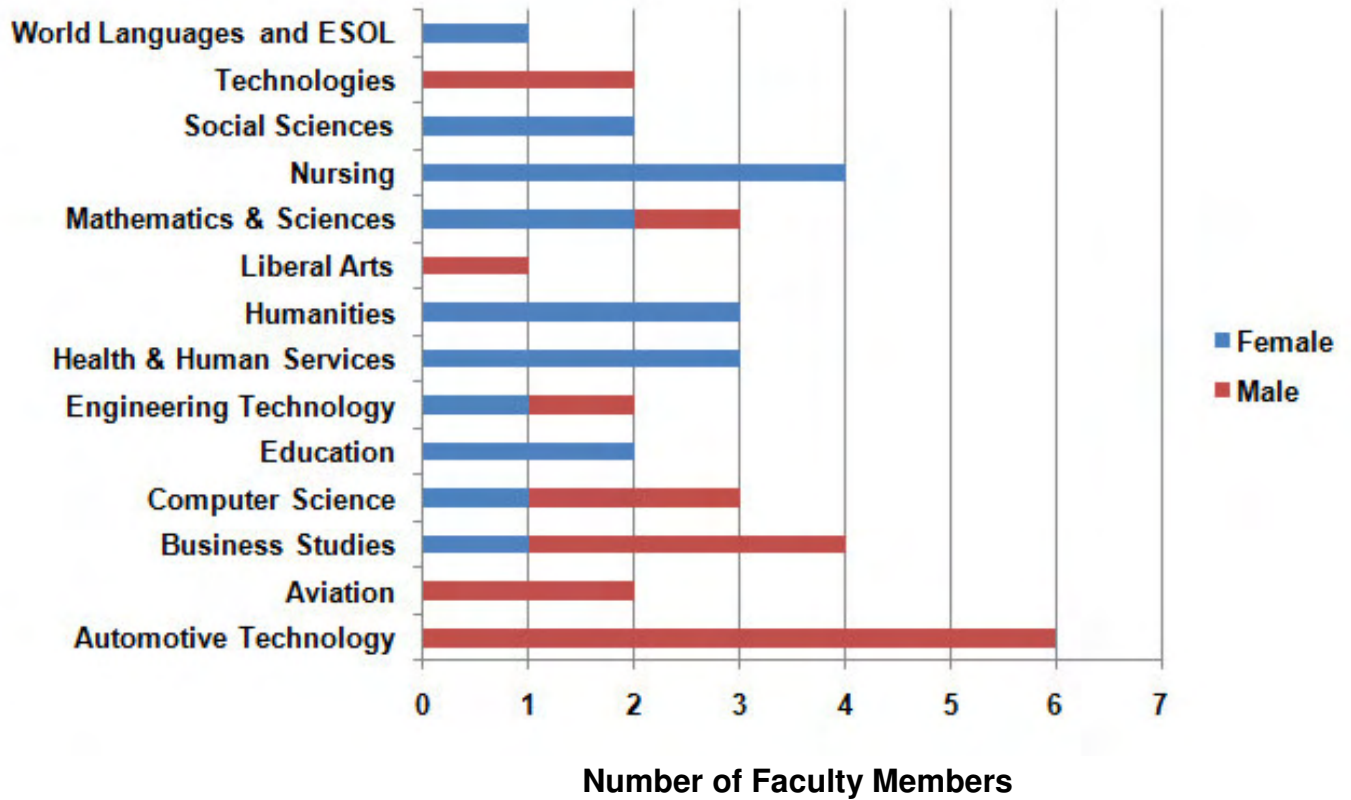

## Full-Time Faculty by Department



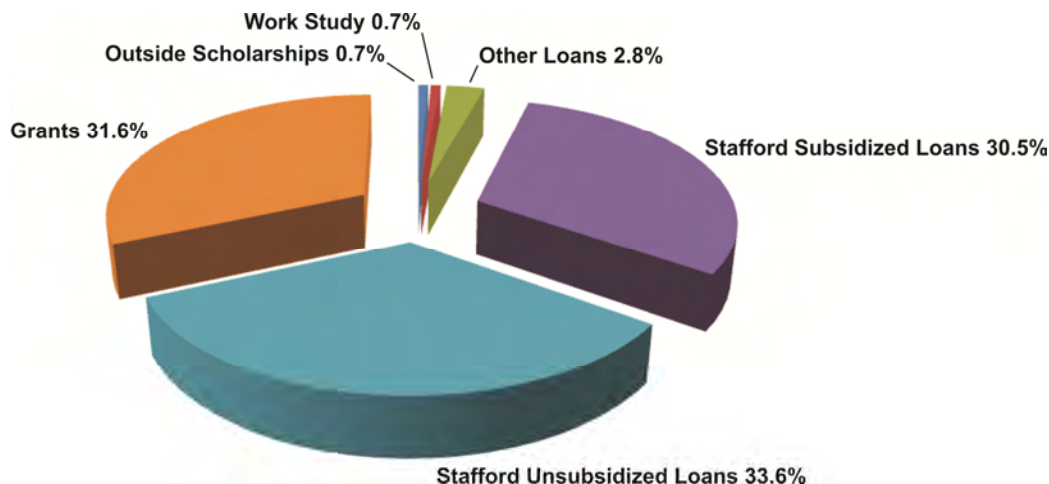
## Financial Aid

### 2009-10 Financial Aid Sources





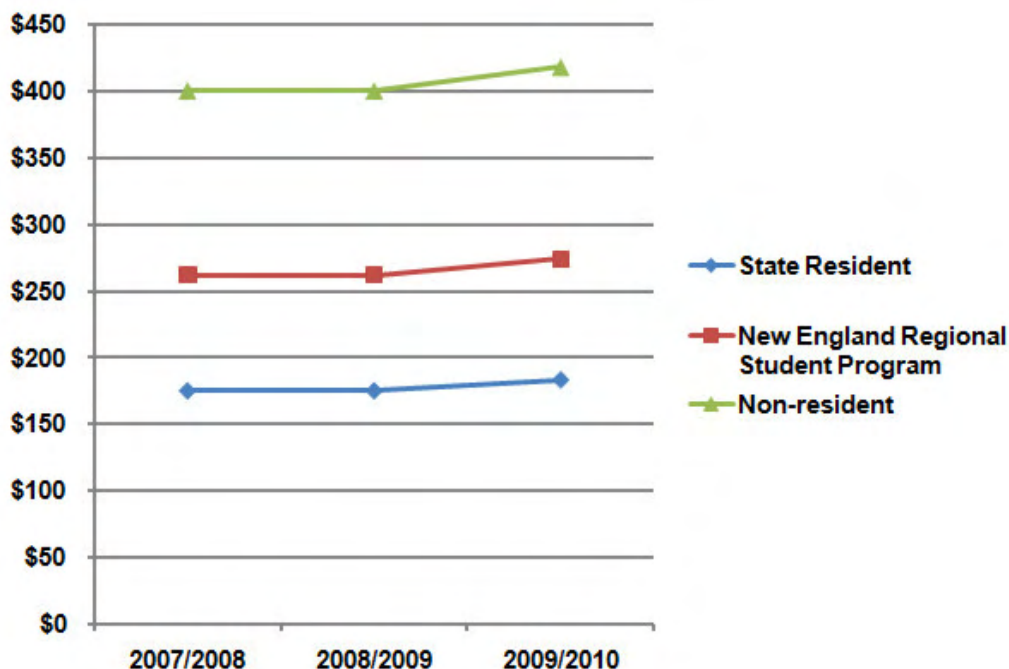
## Tuition and Fees (per credit hour)

### Fall 2009

- The typical full-time student who is registered for 12 hours of courses will pay \$2,196 a semester for in-state tuition or \$5,016 for out-of-state tuition and a minimum of \$192 in mandatory course fees.
- If the student is taking a course that includes a lab, he/she will be charged an additional Academic Instruction Fee of \$60 per lab credit hour.
